The students were challenged to write a story in just 6 words, and against 950 entries.</p> <p>The entry reading: 'Let him cook, whole house burnt' was enjoyed by the Penguin Random House.</p> <p>Judging panel, who noted that it "uses the internet saying, "let him cook" - meaning trust the process - but turns it on its head". They went on to note that "this entry has its own unique voice and brings us into the language used by young people today.</p> <p>National finalists each receive a book bundle from Penguin Random</p>
